Introduction

Student Results Merger for Windows 95, 98, ME, NT, 2000, XP, etc.

Student Results Merger is a program to help you handle / merge / process student results. While the program was developed for the purpose of processing student results, it could also be used to process cycling race, horse race, swimming race, or keeping track of workers or volunteers, and/or various other results.

This program is [FREEWARE](#) – that is, this program is free software. Anyone - any person, any company, or any business - can download, distribute, and use this program for free. No fees or payment is required.

If you need to merge the results from a results spreadsheet into a master spreadsheet, then you could find Student Results Merger to be a very useful program.

In a nut shell, here's a summary of the steps involved when working with Student Results Merger :

1. You paste in a [Master List of Student IDs](#). This data does NOT need to be sorted.
2. You paste in the [Student Results List](#) - consisting of the Student IDs and their Results (Tab, Comma, or Space separated data is supported). e.g. from a spreadsheet. This data does NOT need to be sorted.
3. Click the "[Process Results](#)" button to generate a list of student results in the same order as the master list of student IDs, so that you can easily paste this back into the required column of your results spreadsheet.

At the same time, the program will inform you of any data errors / issues. e.g. if a student has multiple results, if there are results for a student that is NOT in the master list, etc.

If multiple result lines exist for a particular student, then you can select whether to treat this as an error, or get the program to select the highest result via the *When Multiple Result Lines Exist for a Student* options. This is very useful to, for example, process quiz results where students can have multiple attempts at the quiz and it is their highest score that counts as their final result.

N.B. A *Step by Step Guide* with screen shots is provided below.

Note well :

- None of the lists need to be sorted - data is accepted in any order of student ID !
- The order of the results generated matches the order of the master list of student IDs so, you can simply paste the results data into your spreadsheet after the processing is completed.

Developed using 32-bit Delphi.

Why Write this Program ?

This program was written to help the author merge student results for On-Line into Master Results Spreadsheet(s). Prior to having this program, the results from these quizzes were difficult to merge, and the processing involved was time consuming and error prone, so I wrote the program to simplify the process and greatly reduce the chance of errors.

The program can also be used for other activities, such as merging the approved / denied status for Deferred and Supplementary Exams into Master Results Spreadsheet(s), or merging exam results from individual markers into a Master Results Spreadsheet.

So, the program can be very useful for teachers.

Other people may find this program useful. e.g. people who are maintaining the results for cycle races, or car races, etc.

Installing and Using this Program

To use this program, unzip the contents of the ZIP file to a directory - such as c:\Utils\ - and run the executable file : [Student_Results_Merger.EXE](#).

If you want the program to [run automatically](#) when Windows starts up, then select this option under the "File" menu in the program.

If you would like to be able to run this program by clicking on an icon in the [Windows Start Menu](#), or on the [Windows Desktop](#), etc then you can use the "Create Shortcut ..." options under the program's File menu.

I hope you find the program easy to use and useful.

Uninstalling this Program

At the present time, there is No Uninstall function.

If you ever want to delete this program from your computer, then :

- Exit the program, and delete it from wherever you installed it on your harddrive.

Before doing this however :

- If you have selected / enabled the "Auto-Run at Windows Start-up" option (under the File menu), then you should ensure that this option is not checked / enabled (which you can easily do by re-selecting the "Auto-Run at Windows Start-up" option under the File menu).
- If you have used any of the "Create Shortcut ..." options under the File menu, then you should use the "Delete All Shortcuts" option under the File menu to remove these from your system.

Simple as that !

Step by Step "Getting Started" Guide with Screen Shots

In this section, the typical usage of this program will be demonstrated. After this, we will discuss some of the more advanced options.

N.B. Student Results Merger is a program to help you handle / merge / process student results. While the program was developed for the purpose of processing student results, it could also be used to process cycling race, horse race, swimming race, or any other race results.

First off, let's look at a simplified [Master Results Spreadsheet](#) – with just a few students to keep things as simple as possible. In this mythical course, we have two on-line quizzes, 2 assignments, and an exam. For such a course, our Master Results Spreadsheet might look something like this :

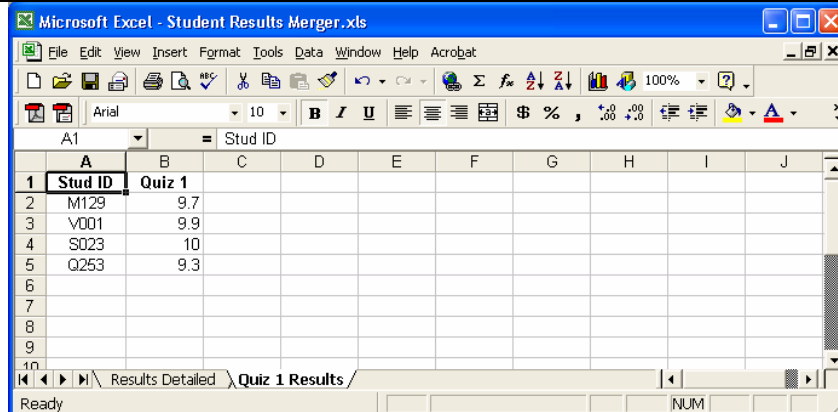

Now, let's pretend that the [first On-line Quiz](#) has finished, and we have downloaded a [CSV](#) of the results. Usually, not all students attempt the quiz, so there are gaps. Our results might look like this :

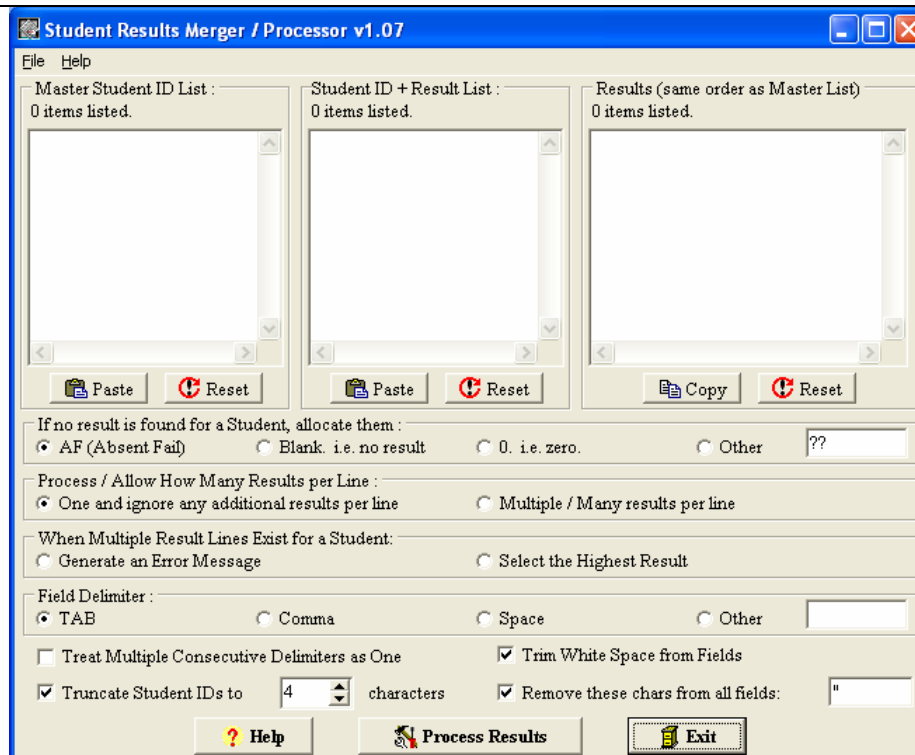

But, when we load them into a spreadsheet and add column headings, these results would look a lot more presentable :

If you compare the student ID's in the Quiz results with our Master Spreadsheet, you will notice that not all students attempted the quiz, and that the data is in different orders. Let's use **Student Results Processor** to get the results into the order we need, and automatically allocate an **Absent Fail (AF)** for any students who did not attempt the Quiz. When **Student Results Processor** is run, you will see this :

Buttons at the bottom include "Help", "Process Results", and "Exit".

The three areas at the top of the program's window above are :

1. **Master Student IDs List**: The **left hand area** is for our Master List of Student IDs – we need to paste the data in from our master spreadsheet.
2. **Student ID + Results List**: The **middle area** is for our results – i.e. a list of Student IDs and their results – again we need to paste the data in from the quiz results CSV file or spreadsheet.
3. **Results List**: The **right hand area** will eventually contain the processed student results, and these will be in the same order as Master Student ID List.

So, let's start with the **left hand area**, which needs to contain our **Master List of Student IDs** – we need to paste the data in from our master spreadsheet. We need to select and then copy this data from our spreadsheet :

Now we need to switch to the **Student Results Processor** (e.g. Alt-Tab) and then click the **"Paste"** button at the bottom of the **"Master Student ID List"** area :

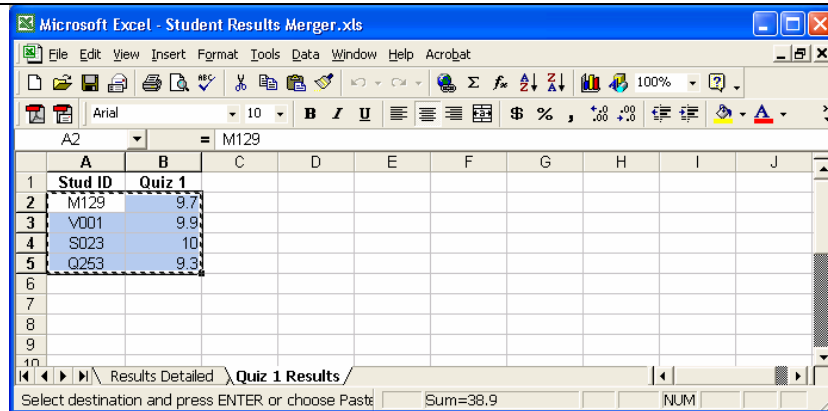

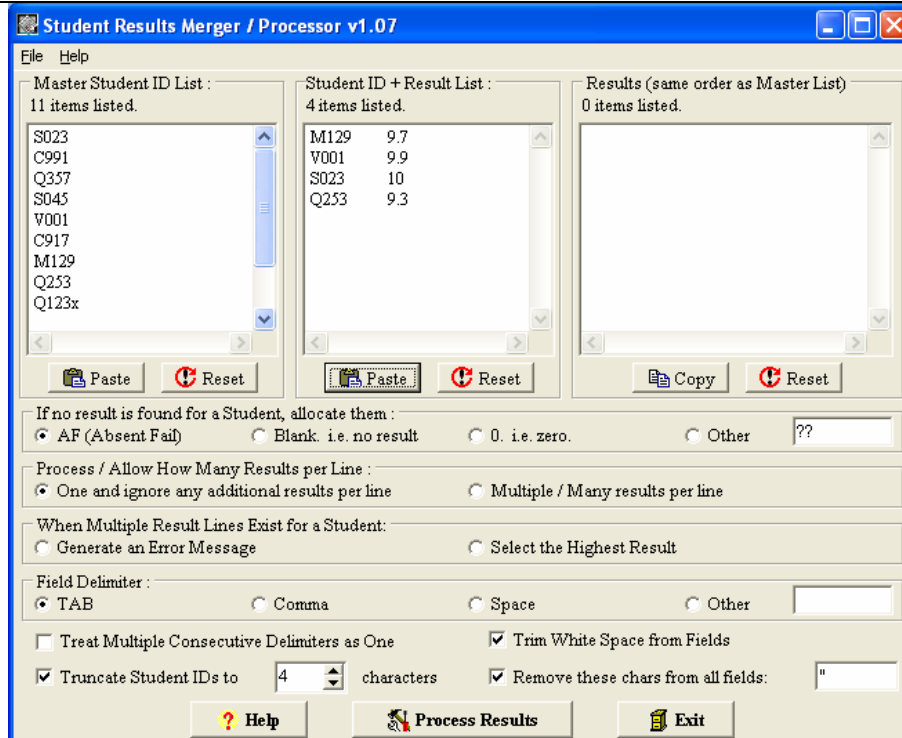

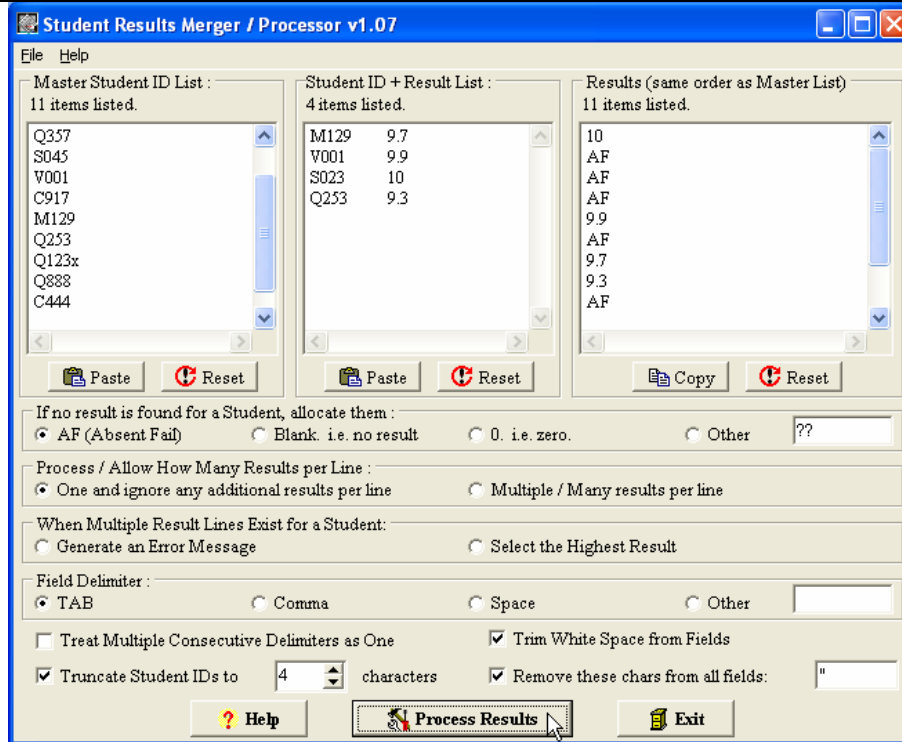
Next, we need to select and copy our quiz results – consisting of the Student ID and quiz result. So, we go back to our spreadsheet select and copy this data as follows :



Now we need to switch to the **Student Results Processor** (e.g. Alt-Tab) and then click the "Paste" button at the bottom of the "Student ID + Result List" area. Also note that because the data comes from a spreadsheet, the data is TAB separated, so we have selected TAB as the delimiter.

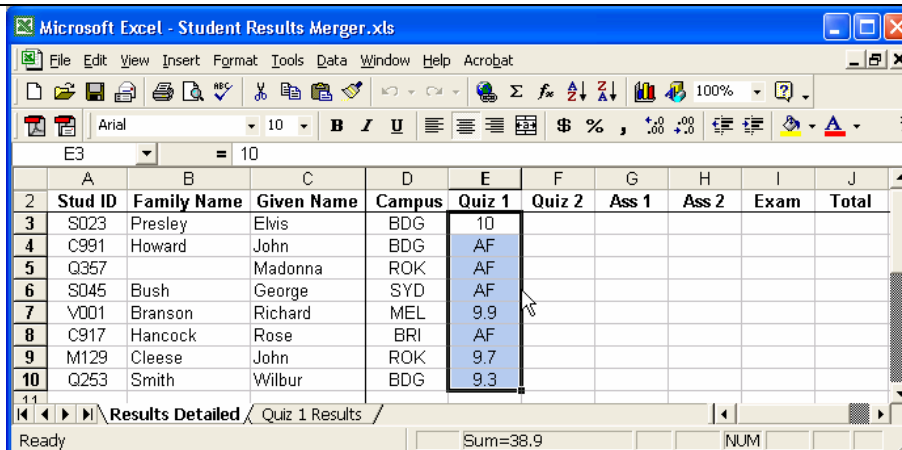


Now we click the "Process Results" button.



And this generates the results for all students and displays a report showing any Errors or the **Errors and Warnings** depending on what reporting option you have selected. Now, we click the "Copy" button at the bottom of the "Results (same Order as Master List)" area:

Finally, we can paste the data into the **Quiz 1** column of our **Master Results Spreadsheet** :



So, as you can see :

- The order of the data does NOT matter – the results are ALWAYS generated in the same order as the Master Student ID List.
- In the above example, an **Absent Fail (AF)** is automatically awarded for any student who did not attempt the assessment, however you can choose to allocate any result you like - via the

an error, or get the program to select the highest result via the *When Multiple Result Lines Exist for a Student* options. This is very useful to, for example, process quiz results where students can have multiple attempts at the quiz and it is their highest score that counts as their final result.

Now, all we need to do is click the "Copy" button below in the "Results" column (on the right), return to Excel, go to the appropriate sheet / tab and column in our Master Spreadsheet, and paste the results in, as follows:

Please Note: One of the results is shown as "***ERROR***" because 2 markers had marked the same assignment for the same student.

Advanced Options

- **If no result is found for a Student, allocate them :**
 - AF (Absent Fail)
 - Blank. i.e. no result
 - 0 i.e. zero.
 - Other

Explanation: If no result is found for a student in the list of results (e.g. because the didn't submit an assignment or sit an exam), then this option specifies what result will be allocated for the student.

- **Process / Allow How Many Results per Line :**
 - One and ignore any additional results per line
 - Multiple / Many results per line

Explanation: If "only 1 result per line" is specified then any other results on the line will be ignored (and reported as warnings on the report – if warnings are specified to be shown). If "multiple results per line" is specified then each line could have any number of results. Example, if you are processing exam results like this :

Q100,10,3,4, 15, 3
 Q200,8,4,3,12,1
 etc

then you would select the "multiple results per line".

- **When Multiple Result Lines Exist for a Student:**
 If multiple result lines exist for a particular student, then you can select whether to treat this as an error, or get the program to select the highest result via the *When Multiple Result Lines Exist for a*

Student options. This is very useful to, for example, process quiz results where students can have multiple attempts at the quiz and it is their highest score that counts as their final result.

- **Field Delimiter :**

- TAB
- Comma
- Space
- Other

Explanation: This is pretty self explanatory. This setting allows you to specify what delimiter is used to separate the fields of your data. If you are copying the data from a **spreadsheet**, then you would have **TAB** separated data.

- **Treat Multiple Consecutive Delimiters as One :**

Explanation: If you data like this :

```
Q100,5
Q200,,,,,3
Q300,,2
```

then it will all be treated like this :

```
Q100,5
Q200,3
Q300,2
```

if you check this option.

- **Truncate Student IDs to NN characters :**

Explanation: This checkbox / setting enables you to specify the trimming of student-ids to allow the correct comparison of master and result student-IDs - which may be of different lengths due to addition of check digits or other items to one or both student IDs. For example, in the Master student-id list, a student ID may be "Q123", but in the results list, the student-id may be "Q123x". To be able to compare these IDs correctly, this "*Truncate Student IDs to NN characters*" option should be used to truncate all student-IDs to 4 characters.

- **Remove these chars from all fields :**

Explanation: If this setting's checkbox is checked, then any characters typed in the data entry box next to it will be automatically removed from all student ID and result data before it is processed further.

Limitations / Restrictions of Use

The Future

In the future, many improvements could be made to this program, such as :

- A [Linux](#) version ? e.g. via [Kylix](#) (which is [Delphi](#) for Linux). This should be pretty easy to do. In the meantime, Linux users could run the Windows version of this program under emulation. e.g. [Wine](#).
- A [MAC OS](#) version ? Again, even if I had to port my code to something similar to C++ Builder, then this should be pretty easy to do. In the meantime, MAC users could run the Windows version of this program under emulation. e.g. [Virtual PC](#).
- Directly linking to spreadsheets - although I am very worried about doing anything like this, as people would need to select :
 - which column in which spreadsheet is their master list of Student IDs,
 - which column in which spreadsheet is the results that they are merging in, and,
 - which column in which spreadsheet is where they want to the merged results to go.

It would be very easy to make a mistake in any of these steps, and it could therefore be fairly easily for people to overwrite results or corrupt spreadsheets. As such, I am very reluctant to explore this functionality further at this stage.

The current solution is much simpler and far less risky or error prone.

This should save people a lot of pre-sorting or post-merging (via multiple columns in a spreadsheet) when multiple markers are involved. If multiple markers mark the same assignment, then it will either be flagged as an error, or the highest result will be selected, depending on the settings you have chosen for <i>When Multiple Result Lines Exist for a Student</i> options.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remove the "On the Error Report, show either All Information, Warning and Error Messages or Error Messages Only" option – the report shown after processing contains multiple tabs – one for Information Messages / Processing summary, one for Warning messages, and one for Error messages.
